The Light is Always On

If anyone has ever had the experience of selling the family homestead after the death of parents, grandparents or any other family member, we all know the feelings around this. It can be guite bittersweet. It usually removes a financial hardship, but it also means an end to an important part of one's family memories, traditions, and history. The Scripture

writers are recording some of those same feelings that we all carry with us, as they reflect on those moments of change and letting go which every and family community experiences.

The Chronicler of this Sunday's First Reading, reflecting on the 70 years that the people of Judah have spent in exile in Babylon, tells the story pointedly. The reason for this exile was the princes, priests and people's infidelity upon infidelity. They mocked, despised, and scoffed every time the compassionate God

tried to keep them from falling into and remaining in faithlessness. The God of their ancestors tried over and over to bring about a remedy in their hearts to keep them safe from the sword and slavery. Yet, they did not listen and their nation collapsed. Still, God's mercy remained strong and rich, and with the help of the King of Persia, God's people are sent back to Jerusalem to construct for God a new dwelling, a new nation of light.

It is a time of great rejoicing - the people of Judah are going home! It is an opportunity to turn around from all their betrayals. The gifts of God are restored and they are invited to live in a new homestead. There will be much work to follow and they are far from out of the dark, but the graces of God will not cease.

This is the theme of this Fourth Sunday of Lent - the graces God never stop. handiwork, created in Jesus Christ rebuild enables us to homesteads. We must lift up our sorrows and fears, in the same way that Jesus was lifted up on the cross. Jesus died but triumphed over our infidelities. He has brought us back into the light and invites us this Lent to do the work of rebuilding and rejoicing that God is in our lives.

We may be saddened at the letting go of former homesteads. Yet, the love of God points us forward with all our memories of

love and kindness. These are the tools we must use to rebuild a new world. Yes, we can easily look at the brokenness which surrounds us today and feel the same despair of those exiled in Babylon. Our journey forward may seem just as treacherous. God, however, has brought us to life with Christ. May this light never flicker but instead remain bright as we create many new homes filled with the light of compassion and faith. -Fr. Michael


EASTER BASKET GIVEAWAY Family to Family


IN THE COMMUNITY
