An Easter Reflection -

How Do We Be Faithful?

When we hear the word fidelity we think of someone being faithful, loyal or trustworthy. Fidelity speaks of a commitment to one's promises, actions, duties and obligations. In our scripture for this Sunday, there is a strong and deep emphasis on fidelity, particularly God's fidelity to each of us.

The depth of God's fidelity is underlined once again in the Acts of the Apostles. Peter and John have healed a paralyzed man and as Peter stands before the crowd who witnessed this miracle, he reminds them of God's fidelity. Throughout their history God has shown through their patriarchs and the prophets the unending commitment to our journey, proclaims Peter. He also repeats to them that the greatest sign of this faithfulness is God's loving servant Jesus.



In St. Luke's Gospel, it is the Risen Jesus who appears to the fearparalyzed disciples and points out God's loyalty by proving to them that he is not a ghost. God's fidelity grounded in Jesus is real and alive. There is however no instant conversion as happened with Thomas last Sunday in this upper room. Sometimes, even though God's faithfulness is constant, it takes a while for us to get beyond our fears and misgivings and become faithful followers.

This is what St. John writes about in his letter to us, our second reading. Our fidelity to God is challenged, at times daily, by the sin that surrounds our lives. The cynicism and negativity of sin easily drags us down, sometimes to hopelessness. It is very difficult when our world is wrapped in such contradiction to God's commandments, for us to respond to others and to God's love.

When trapped in darkness, it is hard to embrace that God choses and is committed to breaking bread with us every day. There is nothing ghostlike about God's desire through the Risen Lord to lead us to repentance. Jesus reparation for our sins, has opened the doors of our fears, so that we can truly be witnesses of God's forgiveness.

The questions each of us might ask ourselves are: "How do we respond to God's remarkable fidelity? How do we make alive our faith in our own acts of fidelity to God? How do we keep from being paralyzed by the sin of the world and witness the miracle of God's mercy? -Fr. Michael

Catholic Choral Society Spring Concerts to Celebrate Society's 75th Anniversary Season




