A Lenten Reflection ~

Planted In Our Gardens

This week it was so nice to see crocuses around the neighborhoods and the beginnings of daffodils and hyacinths. Those of you who are gardeners are probably making your plans for planting vegetables and flowers after Easter, or you are looking at a later time because Easter is so early this year! Some of you may have even started seedlings in your home. The launch of Spring with all its green and colors is happening all around us.

Jesus in St. John's Gospel this Sunday refers to this time of gardening, potting, and bedding. He says, "I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies it produces much fruit." We know he is speaking of his own approaching death. In fact, in this section of the gospel, Jesus is already in Jerusalem and his Passion has begun.

Jesus is quite conscious that his "hour has come." Because of his deep covenant with God, he is also fully aware that because of this "hour" all of humanity is to become glorified, including himself. We, like Jesus and all of his disciples, are called to move from crucifixion to resurrection. We are to die to our "selves," those times when we become totally absorbed with our wants and worries, and those times when we are becoming increasingly narrow minded about others and their needs. When we "plant" all of this on the cross of dying, then we are able to be lifted above all of this and recognize our solidarity with the glory of God and humanity.

We also get a peek of the glory of our humanity in the gospel and Jesus' oneness with it. Jesus speaks of his fears when he says, "I am troubled now. Yet what should I say?" Like in the other three gospels where he is in Gethsemane, Jesus' distress is evident. He understands the triumph of this moment through God's graces, but he has no misconceptions of the pain his humanity is to experience.

This is a lesson for all of our suffering. We do not walk our roads of Calvary alone. Indeed, God has planted in our hearts an instinctual intimacy with God. We are invited to write on the tablets of our hearts the same trust and confidence abiding in Jesus during the time of his Passion. Similar to Jesus becoming the Son of God through this process, this is how we become the children of God. By "keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus" (Hebrews 12:2), we enable our hearts to survive the tests and trials of living and dying. As Jeremiah announces the Word of the Lord, we no longer need to be taught by God "how to know the Lord." Jesus is so rooted in our very beings; all we have to do is continue to love and serve God and every neighbor planted in our gardens. -Fr. Michael


