An Easter Reflection –



From early Lent through to this last Tuesday in Easter, fifteen parishioners read and reflected on a book titled, Let This Be the Time: Spiritual Essentials for Life's Second Act. It was a small book about the 12 needs of the eldering. The needs traveled from The Need to Live a life of Meaning and Purpose to The Need to Prepare for Dying and Death. In between we looked at love and relationships, gratefulness, forgiveness, simplifying, questioning, navigating change, coping with loss, and a few more eldering needs. These conversations and some homemade soup every week made for a wonderful time together!

On the front cover of the book is a beautiful picture of a vine and a branch of bountiful grapes. Little-did-we-know that this would be the theme of this Sunday's scripture - the vine and the branches! But to get us started in our Sunday Word is the story in Acts of the new disciple, Saul, who is now named Paul, and who previously savagely persecuted those early Christians. He arrives in Jerusalem, wants to join the disciples eventhough they fear him and do not trust his newfound belief in Jesus Christ.

Talk about needs! Most of us in our younger years can relate to the desire to fit-in with other people and facing rejection, sometimes including in our own families. It was not a happy time! We are also aware of how our values grow throughout our lives, and at times we are challenged into recognizing that others might not appreciate our transforming progress or our evolving truths for living.



This is where Jesus sees the vine and its branches relating to our spiritual lives with the Father. Jesus preaches that God prunes those branches that do not bear fruit. If we chose to remain close to God on the vine, we must accept this pruning and indeed, be willing to do some pruning ourselves. Jesus reminds us that all of this is possible if we identify his abiding presence in our lives. Through Christ's permanent place in our loving actions, we will certainly bear much fruit.

Like Saul, we too must love, as St. John tells us, "not in word and speech but in deed and truth." Whether we are in our eldering times, or establishing the roots that help us

develop strong branches of faith, we must believe in the name of Christ and love one another. This was how Saul "proved" he was a disciple and removed the fear of others. So, we too must "belong to the truth" and bring our hearts to a greater understanding and appreciation of how the Spirit builds us up. It is his Spirit which helps us to walk in awesome wonder with God and become a Church whose legacy is to bear the good fruit of peace among all women and men.




