

A Pentecost Reflection - The Mighty Acts of God



The Pentecost story in the Acts of the Apostles tells us that a large crowd in Jerusalem from many different countries were "astounded, and in amazement" because those who came out of the Upper Room were all speaking in different languages which matched their "own tongues."

These disciples of Jesus proclaimed to the travelers about "the mighty acts of God." It was the Holy Spirit which "rested on each one of them" that enabled them to do this.

St. John's Gospel tells us that the Risen Lord probably came to that same room. He stood with his disciples to bring them some peace. They had locked the doors, fearing that they were also in danger of losing their lives. Jesus reminds them that they now have received the Holy Spirit. Earlier at their last meal together, Jesus had told them that it is the Father who sends an Advocate who "will teach you everything and remind you all that I told you." (Jn 14:26).

We too need to be reminded by Jesus that all are filled with the Holy Spirit. In a world that repeats the same mistakes and forgets as St Paul tells us, "we were all baptized into one body," we often see our "tongues of fire" as solely given to ourselves. The gifts we receive from the Holy Spirit, the service to others that we form from our gifts, and the working through these gifts to produce goodness and justice, are individually gifted to us. However, God reveals that we all "drink of one Spirit." Similar to the disciples, we lock away our gifts and need Jesus to bring peace into our bodies and spirits. As we consider how and when we offer our service, we need to discern the greater needs to which God calls us to respond. We require time to work out the most true and just ways to bring the many bodies together with the One Christ.

Last Sunday I invited us to remember that before we share the Sign of Peace at mass, we first ask Jesus through the words of our celebrant to "grant us peace and unity." Thus, our greetings to one another at this time are not meant to be like when we simply pass someone at the store or in the hallway. Jesus is calling us *be* God's peace to the world, and to *be authentic* as his sign.

This challenges us to let go of attitudes and behaviors which are not "the mighty acts of God." How can we be "tongues of fire" that are honest and genuine to Jesus and those around us when offered daily "the peace of the Lord," if we want to live fully in the reality of the Spirit? When offered peace, we answer, "And with your spirit." Do we mean this? Are we willing to be an advocate for God's people? Will we open the rooms of our lives and welcome others in peace?
